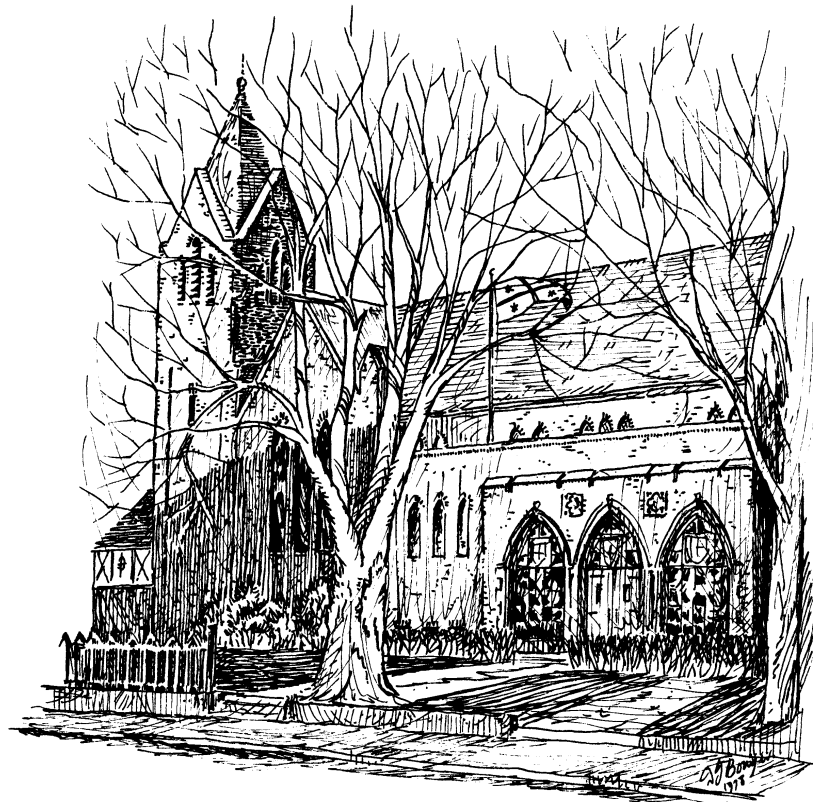

Now it is time to put our cheque books away and pick up our tool belts so let's get started. Volunteers are needed for building and for support activities on site (such as registering volunteers and food serving). Sign up on-line at [www.hfhwr.ca](http://www.hfhwr.ca) When signing up be sure and indicate that you are from St John's. *Special events: Sunday June 8th:* Bishop Bob will lead us in a Holy Eucharist commissioning service at the Cherry St. site at 2:00 pm. All are welcome. *Wednesday July 2nd:* The official build Kick-off at Cherry St., 7:00 a.m., organized by Habitat. Parking is available at the Fred Gies Legion, corner Belmont & Gage Sts. Enter the parking lot via Belmont St. or Gage St. Please park in the designated spaces only. Cross Gage St. and walk a short distance towards Victoria Street along the Iron Horse Trail. The Habitat build site is on your left. Parking is also available at Victoria Bowling Lanes, 280 Victoria St. South, across from City Cafe. Park in the spaces closest to Victoria and go around the building to the Iron Horse Trail. Walk a short distance towards Waterloo to the Habitat build site, which is on your right. Thumbs-up Anglicans, let's get to work!

**SUMMER SAFETY TIP:** The warm weather brings out the runners. Anyone over the age of 35 should check with a family doctor before starting such an exercise program. Examine your running shoes for excessive wear which could contribute to injury. Warm up with stretches before your run and start slowly. You should always be able to carry on a conversation while running. Be visible with bright clothing or a safety vest and dress appropriately for warm weather. Avoid highly polluted areas such as busy streets. Run with a partner particularly if in secluded areas. Run different routes - don't be predictable. Carry a whistle or alarm to ward off attackers.
