**A NOTE FROM YOUR TREASURER:** The past month has been a busy month in the Church Office. We have converted our computer system to account for the HST and new regulations will result in a small reduction in our expenses. Our total receipts from regular givings are up 3.8% from last year and while this is certainly positive it is short of the 10% to which we all committed at the Vestry meeting. Your Parish Executive hopes that everyone will do their best to meet this commitment. The shortfall to date is just over \$8,000 and we will have to take some action in the fall to offset this shortage. I regret that this is not a more positive message and hope that it will give everyone something to think about while enjoying the lazy days of summer.
